Current Status of Comox Valley By-Laws Re: Wood Burning Appliances

Cumberland

In December of 2018, the **Village of Cumberland** passed Solid Fuel Burning
Appliance Bylaw No. 1091, 2018.

It states: No person shall install, or cause to be installed, a solid fuel burning appliance in any new residential building.

Comox

In March of 2019, the **Town of Comox** passed Comox Building Amendment Bylaw 1903.

It states: No person shall design or construct a building or building addition whose heating system or service water heating system relies in whole or in part on the use of a wood burning appliance, install a wood burning appliance in a new building or building addition, or install a wood burning appliance in any other building.

Courtenay

In May of 2020, the **City of Courtenay** passed Building Amendment Bylaw No. 3004, 2020 Solid Fuel Burning Appliances.

It states: No person shall design or construct a new building nor add to or renovate to an existing building where the heating system or service water heating system relies in whole or part on the use of a solid fuel burning appliance.

Comox Valley

The Comox Valley Regional District initiated the Airshed Roundtable Project, which may elect to impose further restrictions on such things as installation, replacement, fuel, acceptable time of use, or other measures with respect to wood burning appliances.
